**Clinical Evaluation** 

Students must complete all basic nursing skills, adhere to expected student expectations, complete related clinical paperwork, and receive an overall satisfactory (S) grade for the clinical rotation. Satisfactory is determined by the assigned instructor based on best practice principles and according to the following guidelines:

Pass/Fail System
