- B. 6 credit hours (5 classroom; 1 clinical)
- C. Adult Health Nursing I is the first of two courses designed for students to utilize clinical reasoning abilities and critical thinking skills in relation to the health care continuum of the adult client. This course transitions student from Practical Nursing to the Professional Nursing related to nursing care of adults with alterations in selected body systems. (F, S).
- D. Fulfills Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree requirement.

XII. OUTSIDE OF CLASS ACADEMICALLY RELATED ACTIVITIES

The U.S. Department of Education mandates that students be made aware of expectations regarding coursework to be completed outside the classroom.
